GrubBy RobinThis type of book is a favorite of the main stream publishing biz: the themed trade paperback. In this case the theme is a fun look at fast food and like similar books it is a mix of various authors and strong graphic presentation. It is also similar in that the quality of the contents varies enormously, depending on one's taste of course.I prefer the more visual presentations of grub served up in these pages: a wonderful spread of food coins dished up by the Franklin Kitchen; artist Lou Brooks spread on Bad Manners; Robin Green's the '24-hour breakfast' or a knockout photorealist painting (over a spread) of a Howard Johnson's in Williamstown, Massachusetts by the great John Baeder. Perhaps way over the top are the twenty-four pages devoted to the Century-O-Progress' fair, a sort of guide that contains flashes of brilliance but really goes on far too long.Overall I thought 'Junk Food' was a better than average humor book. It was published in 1980 and more or less disappeared quite quickly from bookstores

across the country. Worth searching out if you can find it cheap enough, as are these themed paperbacks: *The 80s: A Look Back at the Tumultuous Decade 1980-1989*; *The Book of Sequels*; *Titters: The first collection of humor by women* and *The Big Book of New American Humor: The Best of the Past 25 Years*.***LOOK AT SOME INSIDE PAGES by clicking 'customer images' under the cover.
