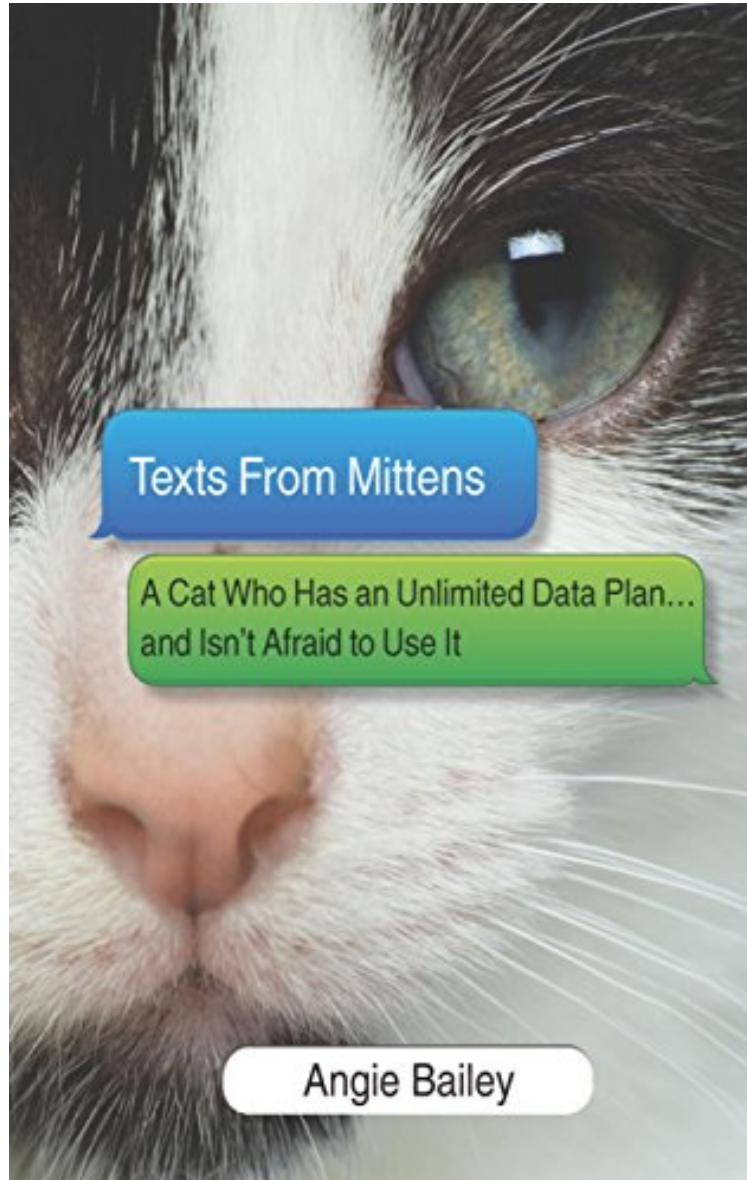

The book is short -- barely 100 pages -- but it's filled with some of the best texts discussions from Angie's blog plus some new ones. There's a character guide at the beginning so you'll get to know the key players in Mittens's life: Drunk Patty (the tipsy neighbor), Stumpy (Mittens best kitty friend), Phil (the "filthy beast" of a dog who shares the house with Mittens and Mom), etc. Mittens has a particular affinity for Judge Judy and is no stranger to online shopping, either. A typical conversation between Mittens and his human: "Stumpy ditched me for that tramp of a tabby. -- Sorry, Mitty! What happened to "bros before hoes"? -- But you ditched him last week and took a nap. "Doze before bros" is completely acceptable. #LookItUp" --- --- --- Mittens seems to be getting the hang of the hash-tag, too. Really, most of these are quite clever, and definitely show the self-centered self-righteous attitude of cats, familiar to those of us who have had the pleasure of sharing our lives with them over the years.
