Skits carry over to other tracks. For example on Disc 1 Track 3 is the last 20 seconds of skit 2 and then a completely different skit. Track 8 is an entire skit, and then 40 seconds of the next skit. When listening to the CDs I didn't notice but when I ripped them to put on my phone and when I was applying titles I found out I need to correct the tracks as well. For example disc 1 is 2 episodes with 20 tracks total. Show one is 10 tracks. But there are actually 13 skits. And it's not just that some tracks have multiple short skits, oh no.
