Dino Tripodis do his act, you'd know that a lot of his material revolves around his love of distilled spirits. He usually appears with a drink in hand and works the audience with a cool humor that might remind one of another Dino also from Steubenville, Ohio. So it comes as no surprise that he would write a book about one of his favorite things. As a fan of his stand-up, I was interested in reading his book, but as a non-drinker, I assumed there wouldn't be much that would appeal to me. I'm happy to say that it was a fun read, even though I won't be installing a bar to try out the recipes. Most fun are the names for the drinks that he comes up with ("O Tan and Bombed" a Harps and liquor mix that sounds perfectly awful and a coffee and Baileys Irish Cream concoction called "The George Bailey" that sounds rather appealing). He augments the recipes with stories about the quest to come up with the drinks along with three friends who risked their marriages (and their livers) to make the stumbling "Advent-"ure with him. Tripodis also punctuates the recipes with one-liners from his stand-up act ("I don't drink compulsively, I drink consistently. There's a difference") that provide a few additional chuckles. It would make a good pick for your drinking buddies, but the tee-totaler will get through it a lot faster (I read it in a little over an hour) and without a designated driver.
