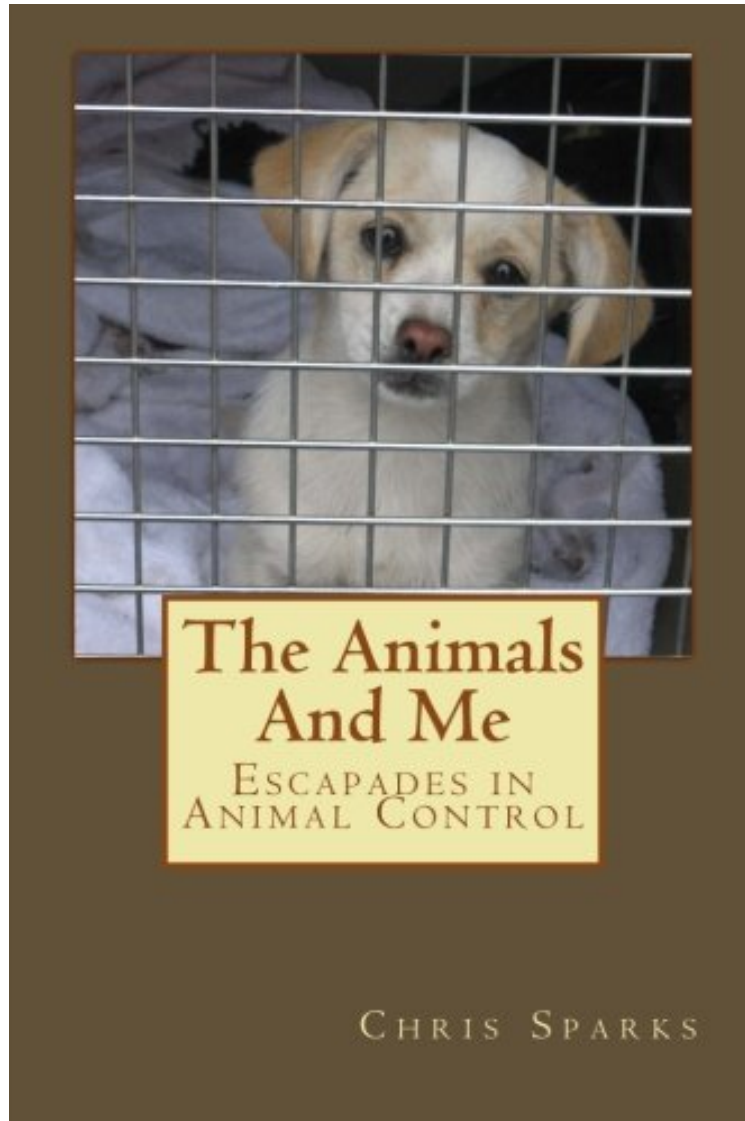

This is a good read for animal lovers, although the editing could have been better.
