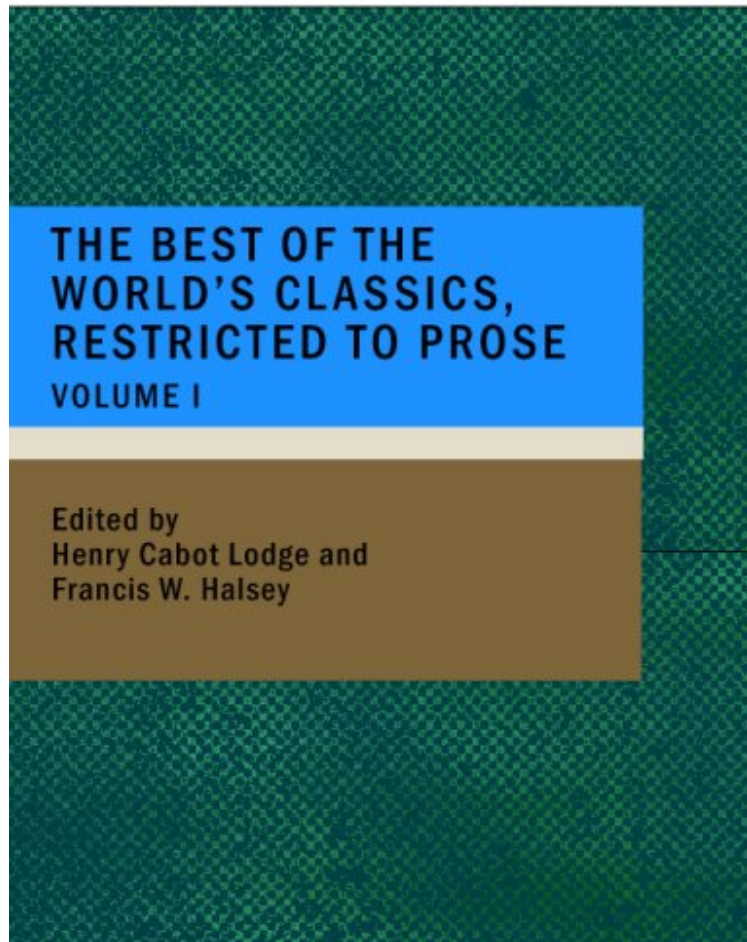

Survey of, and selections from, great worksBy LibrarianOriginally published in 1909 by Funk Wagnalls (the same year as "The Harvard Classics"), this is the first of a ten-volume guided tour through some of the world's best literature (to that date). This wonderful collection should not be confused with another public domain set titled "The World's Greatest Books" (of which volumes 1-15 19 are available); in that set longer works, such as famous novels, are merely adaptations, rewritten and greatly shortened versions, so the reader essentially gets an amplified plot summary rather than the real thing. For that reason I cannot recommend it. THIS

SET, "The Best of the World's Classics Restricted to Prose," takes another (and I think better) approach by providing selections from works too lengthy to provide in toto; these excerpts impart a feel of the original inasmuch as each appears as actually written rather than in someone else's adaptation. In essence, this is not unlike a college survey textbook; I say this not pejoratively but descriptively, and any single item found to be of particular interest can usually be found full-length as a public domain freebie in the Kindle Store or at Gutenberg.org. Thus this collection serves a real and vital purpose as a "sampler" for those who have never read these authors and their works before and as a "refresher" for those who have. There are separate volumes for Greece and Rome, the U.S. and Great Britain, and for other countries; you will want them all, and I would recommend this set to any literate person.
