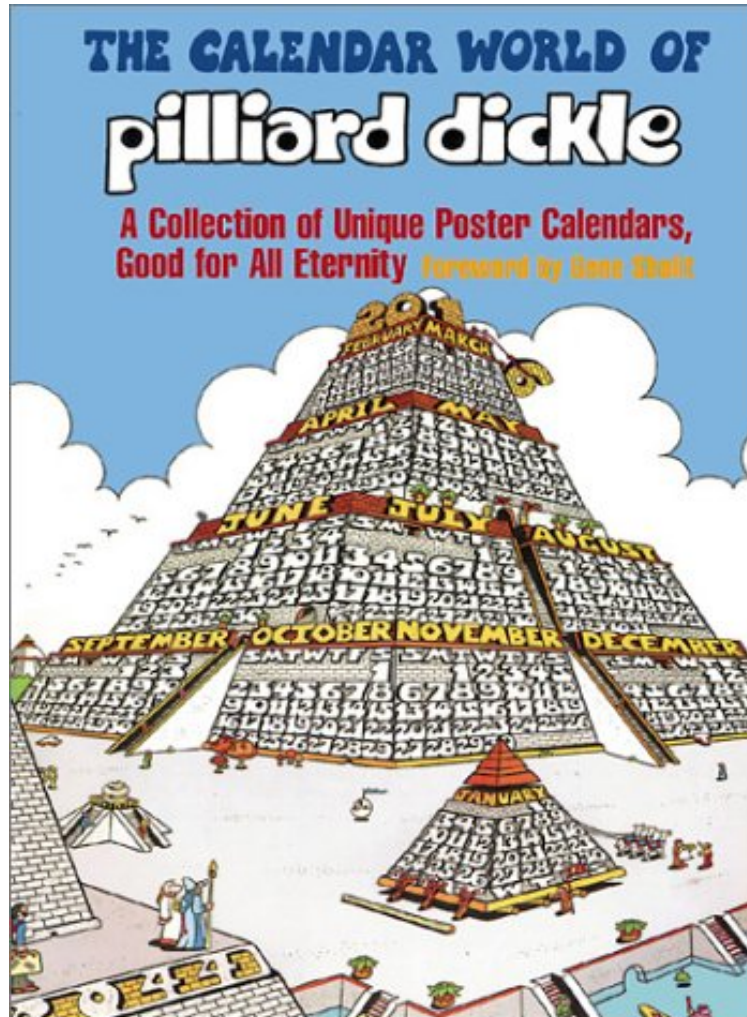

The first thing to say about Pilliard Dickle is: that's not his real name. ("My parents would never be so cruel," he says.) It's Joe Chandler, and he lives with his wife Natalie and their dog Waggo and cat Daniel. (Don't you hate it when authors start listing their pets? Who cares about his dog, even if she IS learning to play the xylophone?) (Really!) Joe and Natalie are nudists (you might know them from Joe and Natalie's Naked Page) and work to promote an understanding of the positive nature of nudism. In addition to calendars, Joe (aka Pilliard Dickle) writes whimsical songs. He performs them with his partner, the past Pilliard Dickle, who is recorded on a boom box.
